## Where is the camp located?

Kids Camp will be hosted at Trinity Parish Church (215 St George St, St. Augustine, FL 32084)

## Will my insurance pay for the cost of camp?

No, insurance pays for clinical & therapeutic services, not camp itself. CampAbility is recreational & educational, not clinical. However, we do offer scholarships to those eligible.

## Does my child have to go all 6 weeks? Do you only offer full-time?

No, your child is not required to go all 6 weeks, nor have to attend full-time. We offer a weekly rate (\$175/week) and a daily rate (\$50/day), which allows for part-time attendance. However, when you register and submit your deposit/payment, you'll need to specify which days and weeks your child will be attending for staffing purposes.

## What special needs will be represented in your camp? Does my child need to be potty trained?

- The camp is open to those with developmental, intellectual, and physical disabilities (i.e. has an IEP or 504 Plan). \*Please note our camp does **not** specialize in behavioral & mental health services nor medically complex needs. We do not offer 1:1 staff. *However*, if you would like to talk with us about being able to meet your child's needs, please call us so we can have a dialogue & assess.
- Your child is not required to be potty trained. We understand children with special needs are at different points in reaching milestones. It would be your responsibility to provide daily pullups, wipes, and a change of clothing.

## Do I provide lunch and snacks for my child?

Yes, due to the various dietary restrictions many of our children have, we have determined it best for parents to provide the lunch and snacks based on their camper's restrictions and preferences. We will have water available to the campers all day, and some basic snacks on standby (goldfish, crackers, pretzels). If there is a special snack the teacher would like to give the campers because of the theme of the week, you will be asked about it prior to the camper receiving the snack.

## What is the teacher to camper ratio?

There will be 2-3 staff per 10 campers. There will be a 2 co-teachers. We will also have additional volunteers. All staff & adult volunteers have background checks done. All teen volunteers have checked references with statements of recommendation.
